

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Student Scholarship Programme

1 Purpose

Acorns International School has committed itself to grant scholarships and awards to need-based students who demonstrate excellent academic achievement, high behavioural standards, a commitment to serve their school and community, excel in creativity, and critical thinking skills, and demonstrate leadership skills and team spirit.

The Scholarship Programme will offer a partial tuition fee exemption annually all at the school's discretion. Every year, the number of scholarships is approved by the Board of Directors and will be communicated to families when the application period opens.

To qualify for the scholarship award, members of the Acorns Family are expected to uphold the standards, beliefs and values of Acorns.

2 Scope and Eligibility

Scholarships and awards will be awarded basis of need and must merit at least one of the following parameters:

- Academics
- Arts
- Athletics
- Contribution to the Acorns and broader community

At the time of application, the student must be enrolled in the Secondary Department. Families residing in Uganda for a minimum period of 3 years. Each student can receive no more than one type of scholarship per academic year at a time.

3 Definitions

Secondary Programme/Secondary Students

• Students in MYP1 - MYP5 and DP yearbands. To apply for a scholarship, a student must be currently in one of these year bands.

Scholarship Committee

 A selected panel to review all scholarship applications. Comprises either the Head of School or Deputy Head of School, the Head of Secondary, and the Head of Admissions and Advancement. Additional members may be selected from Acorns staff or the Parent Teacher Organisation.

4 Application Process

Scholarship application forms will be made available online and communication will go out when the applications open and a deadline is given. Family/students are requested to complete application forms and submit them before the communicated deadline.

Each application form will be valid for one academic year ONLY. To qualify for the following year, a new application form needs to be submitted and will be subject to review by the Scholarship Committee.

Please note that each application will be carefully assessed, and the weight given to each application will depend on the thoroughness and quality of the documentation submitted. Strong documentation will significantly strengthen the case for your application.

Once submitted, the Scholarship Committee will rate the quality of the application to shortlist candidates.



Recommendation Letters

Applications may include the submission of recommendations from community members; ie mentors, coaches, spiritual leaders, family members, etc. Acorns staff CAN NOT make these recommendations.

Recommendation Letter formats can be found in the application Google Form, <u>via this link</u> or at the QR code right.

Recommendation letters must be submitted to the Head of Admissions and Advancement directly emailed from the referee at admissions@ais.ac.ug or hand-delivered via a sealed envelope addressed to the Head of Admissions and Advancement.

The Scholarship Committee may reach out to the referee while reviewing applications for further details.

Shortlisted Candidate Interviews

Only shortlisted candidates will be contacted for an interview with the Scholarship Committee. The student applying must attend their interview to be considered further. They are encouraged to be supported by a parent or family member. In the email inviting the applicant to the interview, there will be guidelines on the interview expectations.

Awarding

Before awarding any scholarship, the Scholarship Committee may also conduct internal investigations into students' academic achievements, behaviour and participation in school activities.

Upon concluding the process, the Scholarship Committee will let the awardees know via email of their success. No public statements will be made as to who received a scholarship will be made.

5 Scholarship Committee Responsibilities

It is the responsibility of the Scholarship Committee to maintain the integrity of the application and awarding process. All applications submitted on time must be given equal consideration.

The Scholarship Committee is also responsible for the following:

- Maintaining and updating the online application form.
- Setting all deadlines; when the application form opens/closes, interviews are scheduled, and awardees are notified.
- Maintaining all communication with the Acorns Community and applicants.
- Developing a fair rubric in line with application expectations.

6 Awardee Conduct Expectations

Scholarship recipients must adhere to the school's values. Actions contrary to these may lead to scholarship revocation mid-year. This encompasses academic dishonesty, misconduct, or behaviours detrimental to the school community, by the student or their family.
