IB Evaluation Visit

Our IB Visit is quickly approaching!

For families new to Acorns, we are proud to be an International Baccalaureate(IB) continuum school, which emphasises growth and reflection. Every five years, IB schools must take part in an evaluation cycle designed to strengthen teaching and learning.

Over the last 5 years, we have completed:

- Self-Study: Taking an in-depth look at the IB Standards and Practices and how well we meet them.
- Programme Development Plan(PDP): Through the Self-Study, the community identified Wellbeing for the PDP. Developed Plans are ongoing for Child Protection, Staff Wellbeing, Diversity, Equity, Justice and Inclusion(DEIJ), and Social Emotional Learning(SEL).
- Preliminary Review: Last May, our Curriculum Coordinators completed IB-mandated documentation that communicates how our programme practices meet IB standards.

The final step is to complete the visit, which will be conducted in November. During this visit, we will welcome IB leaders to provide us with feedback, celebrate what we do well and guide our next steps.

Important Reminders

- **Punctuality**: We have noticed challenges with punctuality. This is a reminder that students should arrive at school by 7:35 AM, as lessons begin promptly at 7:45 AM. Arriving on time helps your child make the most of their learning and ensures a smooth start to the day. Persistent late arrivals will be followed up by the school and may result in further consequences.
- Attendance Excusals: Submit any absence or tardy notices via Toddle Attendance Excusals.
- On-Campus Sickness: If students feel unwell at school, they must report to the nurse. The school will contact parents, and students should not do so themselves
- Sickness: Keep unwell students at home to prevent spreading illness.
- **Return to School:** After extended absences due to sickness, please inform the Head of Secondary via email to support the monitoring of your child's progress

These electronic standardized tests are administered twice a year and give us valuable insight into student progress across specific skill areas. The results will help refine teaching approaches and strengthen learning experiences in the months ahead.

On Wednesday, September 17, we hosted our Coffee with Curriculum Coordinator (CCC) event, led by our Learner Support Team. Families joined us for an Inclusion & Enrichment Workshop themed "Partners in Progress: Identifying and Removing Barriers to Students' Learning Together."

We are thrilled to share that starting this term, our students in EYP2 through DP2/A2 will be taking part in Safer, Smarter Schools, a world-class personal safety and abuse prevention programme. Every student in these grades will have between 4 and 10 lessons per year.

What makes this such a great fit for our current curriculum? Not only does it reinforce many of the values we already teach: respect, kindness, safety, and emotional awareness. It gives students concrete tools:

- how to recognise unsafe situations
- build support networks
- speak up when something feels wrong.

We believe this will make our community even stronger, safer, and more caring, and that's something we can all celebrate.

Part of this programme is Safer, Smarter Families. It supports parents and caregivers too: there's a toolkit for parents and guardians with tips, resources and videos, bridging school and home in safety education.

The Learner Support Team, helps identify and reduce barriers to learning across the school.

We use a three-tier model to ensure students get the right support at the right time.

- Tier 1: We work with teachers in classrooms to embed inclusive differentiation practices that benefit all learners.
- Tier 2: Students needing extra support attend Enrichment sessions to build skills and confidence. This may be through one-to-one lessons or in small group lessons.
- Tier 3: Learners requiring additional support receive Individual Education Plans and accomadations that fit the need of the student.


